What is Fraud?

- Fraud is:
 - Deliberately deceive, trick or cheat to gain advantage or something of value
- Fraud means:
 - To misrepresent services provided in an attempt to receive additional compensation
- An example:
 - Reporting that a brand name drug was dispensed when a generic was dispensed, with the intent of receiving increased federal reimbursement.



What is waste?



- Waste is:
 - To use , consume, spend or expend resources thoughtlessly or carelessly.
- Waste means:
 - The extravagant, careless or needless expenditure of funds that results from deficient practices, system controls or decisions and results in increased costs to Federal Health Care Programs.
- An Example:
 - Improper drug utilization or other protocols that result in poor quality of care, requiring additional medications paid for with Federal Health Care program dollars.

What is Abuse?



- Abuse means:
 - Any activities or practices that are inconsistent with sound fiscal, business, or medical practices and either directly or indirectly result in unnecessary costs to Federal Health Care Programs.
- An example:
 - Inadequate controls that result in failing to report rebates or discounts.

Concerns:

- Fraud, Waste and Abuse costs taxpayers and insurance companies billions of dollars each year!
- Also, it can damage our public image

- **Prevent:**
 - Be trained and educated on matters related to your role
 - Spread the message
- **Detect:**
 - Keep the examples in mind and look out for potential fraud, waste or abuse.
