What is Fraud?

• Fraud is:

 Deliberately deceive, trick or cheat to gain advantage or something of value

• Fraud means:

 To misrepresent services provided in an attempt to receive additional compensation

An example:

 Reporting that a brand name drug was dispensed when a generic was dispensed, with the intent of receiving increased federal reimbursement.



What is waste?

• Waste is:

 To use, consume, spend or expend resources thoughtlessly or carelessly.

Waste means:

 The extravagant, careless or needless expenditure of funds that results from deficient practices, system controls or decisions and results in increased costs to Federal Health Care Programs.

An Example:

 Improper drug utilization or other protocols that result in poor quality of care, requiring additional medications paid for with Federal Health Care program dollars.



What is Abuse?



Abuse means:

 Any activities or practices that are inconsistent with sound fiscal, business, or medical practices and either directly or indirectly result in unnecessary costs to Federal Health Care Programs.

An example:

 Inadequate controls that result in failing to report rebates or discounts.

Concerns:

- Fraud, Waste and Abuse costs taxpayers and insurance companies billions of dollars each year!
- Also, it can damage our public image
