### INTRODUCTION

- Federal health programs, including Medicaid, lose billions of dollars annually because of fraud, errors, and abuse
- Federal and State laws apply to Fraud, Waste and Abuse (FWA). Contracts with Community Care, Inc. include requirements to be in compliance with Federal and State Laws.
- > This training is designed to inform Providers how to correct and report FWA.

#### YOUR RESPONSIBILITY AS A PROVIDER

You must comply with all applicable statutory, regulatory and other program and contract requirements governing FWA.

You must report any FWA concerns and suspected or actual violations that you know about.

# CORRECTING FRAUD, WASTE AND ABUSE

## Once Fraud, Waste or Abuse has been detected, it must be corrected!

- You must create a corrective action plan to correct the violations and to prevent it from happening again.
- > The plan must address the particular problem identified. Include timeframes for specific actions to be corrected.
- Document what was done to address the problem with the employee. Include consequences for not making the changes.
- Monitor the plan to ensure it is working.

# **EXAMPLES OF CORRECTIVE ACTIONS YOU CAN TAKE**

- > Adopting new policies or document review requirements
- Conducting training
- Providing educational materials
- Revising policies or procedures
- Send warning letters to offending employee
- Taking disciplinary action against offending employee or terminating an employee
